II. Job Summary

The Board will support the work of the Until We Are All Free Movement (UWAAFM) and provide mission-based leadership and strategic governance. While UWAAFM's Executive Directors lead day-to-day operations, the Board-Executive Directors relationship is a partnership, and the appropriate involvement of the Board is both critical and expected.

III. Essential Job Functions

1. Leadership, governance and oversight

- Serving as a trusted advisor to the Executive Directors as s/he develops and implements UWAAFM's strategic plan
- Reviewing outcomes and metrics created by UWAAFM for evaluating its impact and regularly
 measuring its performance and effectiveness using those metrics; reviewing agenda and supporting
 materials before board and committee meetings
- Approving UWAAFM's annual budget, audit reports, and material business decisions; being informed
 of and meeting all legal and fiduciary responsibilities
- Contributing to an annual performance evaluation of the Executive Directors
- Assisting the Executive Directors and board chair in identifying and recruiting other Board Members
- Partnering with the Executive Directors and other board members to ensure that board resolutions are carried out
- Representing UWAAFM to stakeholders; acting as an ambassador for the organization
- Ensuring UWAAFM's commitment to a diverse board and staff that reflects the communities UWAAFM serves

2. Fundraising

UWAAFM Board Members will consider UWAAFM a philanthropic priority and actively seek out funds that reflect that priority. So that UWAAFM can credibly solicit contributions from foundations, organizations, and individuals. Board members will be expected to collaborate on fundraising to set and meet fundraising goals.

IV. Position Requirements:

This is an extraordinary opportunity for an individual who is passionate about UWAAFM's mission and who has a track record of board leadership. Selected Board Members will have achieved leadership stature in business, government, philanthropy, or the nonprofit sector. His/her accomplishments will allow him/her to attract other well-qualified, high-performing Board Members.

V. Board terms/participation/What to Expect

- UWAAFM's Board Members will serve a three-year term to be eligible for re-appointment for one additional term. Board meetings will be held quarterly, and committee meetings will be held in coordination with full board meetings.
- Board meetings will be held quarterly. Attendance is expected at all quarterly board meetings (3 hours) and attendance for at least eight meetings per year when meeting monthly around 4:30 pm on the second Tuesday each month (2 hours). UWAAFM might need some members of the Board to attend committee meetings.
- Meetings will be in person whenever possible. Virtual meetings will be held as needed.
- Serving on committees or task forces and taking on special assignments
- Service on UWAAFM's Board of Directors is a voluntary investment of time, except for administrative support, travel, and accommodation costs in relation to Board Members' duties.
